# Urgent care or emergency care?

Illnesses and injuries don't always happen during regular office hours. If you need care and you don't have a regular doctor, how do you know whether to seek care at the hospital emergency department or an urgent care center? Below are some guidelines.

# **URGENT CARE**

An urgent care center is designed to assist you when you don't have a regular doctor, or when your need is after hours or on weekends. Hours very but generally are limited to daytime but some offer evening hours.

#### When to go to an urgent care center

- For colds, coughs, flu, fever
- Minor injuries
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Allergies
- Dizziness
- Nausea
- Minor burns
- Minor cuts
- Sprained ankle or other joint area
- Pink eye
- Rash
- Sore throat
- Need for stitches
- Migraine headaches
- Urinary tract infections
- Minor broken bones
- Skin irritations
- Poison oak

# **EMERGENCY CARE**

The hospital emergency room treats serious or life-threatening illnesses & injuries and is always open. If you feel you need to go the hospital, do not use an ambulance unless it's an absolute emergency. It is very expensive.

### When to seek emergency care

- If your doctor tells you to
- If you are injured in a care accident
- Uncontrollable bleeding
- Severe difficult breathing
- Fall from a significant height
- Serious head or neck injury
- Loss of consciousness
- Chest pain
- High fever that doesn't get better with medicine
- Bone fracture with open wound
- After swallowing poison
- Seizure
- Severe abdominal pain
- Severe burns
- Electric shock
- Suspicion of exposure to a serious communicable disease
- Chocking
- Severe allergic reactions
